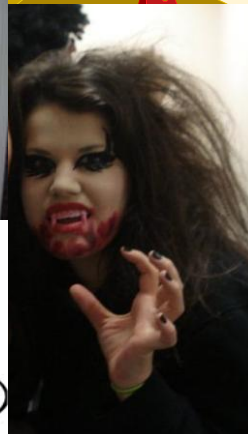

No Classes on Columbus Day!

Many countries in the Americas and elsewhere celebrate the anniversary of Christopher Columbus's arrival, which occurred on October 12, 1492, as an official holiday. In the U.S., Columbus Day first became an official state holiday in Colorado in 1906, and became a federal holiday in 1937. However, people have celebrated Columbus's voyage since the colonial period. Actual observance varies in different parts of the United States, ranging from large-scale parades and events to complete non-observance. San Francisco, California claims the nation's oldest continuously existing celebration with the Italian-American community's annual Columbus Day Parade, which was established by Nicola Larco in 1868.
